A Rescue Story, by Susan Young

I have a wonderful story to tell. I have had this very active mal rescue for a year now. She has come a long long way from the young lady she first was. She was biting my hands when I opened her crate, but not out of meanness. She was so excited to get out that she started to chomp and often got my hands. Putting her in a crate was always a fight. By this January, she knew not to climb my counters. She could play ball, be off leash and trusted around here. She no longer tried to kill my other dogs and could be out in the yard with them. She was still way too active for a normal home. This girl could not settle down for more than two minutes in the room while I was on the computer. I always had to follow her around to keep her out of trouble. She excelled in tracking and hunted for the glove around the house. Crates were now a good thing because that meant going for a ride in the car to a tracking site. She could heel, sit, and down on command. It was obvious to everyone that this girl that I had fallen in love with also loved me with all her heart. She caused me a ton of extra work and destroyed some expensive things, but we loved each other. I had to find a place for this girl where she would have a job with her owner and not be left alone at home. I found out about a man named Billy from a friend. He is one of the top of the line known for training canines. He runs one of seven departments of the Laredo Job Corps, the canine training group. Kids in this group sign up for two years to learn

how to become dog handlers and Billy guides them in teaching the dogs to become police canines in several different venues. I have had many rescues over the last 35 years, of several different breeds. Something told me that my mal belonged with Billy. She was a special case and needed a special touch. So, with permission, I drove my love to Texas last week and spent three days there. At first, my girl was kenneled with one of the dogs from home, to assist with her adjustment period. She would play retrieve games, but only with me, at first. But now, she is forming a bond with her two young handlers who play with her daily and take care of all of her needs. I spoke to Billy last night and he thinks she is very smart and will make a great dog. (which I already knew!) She loves the kids. They are working with her now on basics. In the spring when the weather warms up, they will be concentrating on scent work. She is ahead of the game because I had been doing scent work with her at home. She will be tested to see what she is best with, explosives, narcotics, cadaver, or maybe more than one. And best of all, I am sending Billy construction plans for agility equipment. The kids are going to build it and I am going down this summer to teach the kids how to use it. Billy says his dogs have to work in all kinds of weather, but I will be sure to get him to buy some wading pools. So, I will get to see my girl again. I am so very proud of what I know this girl will become.
