Numerous hours are spent by the DOT making class schedules, organizing classes, getting instructors, and many other tasks. It is a hard position and Jane did a great job. Thank you Jane, for your service to the club.

Some of you already know me and some do not, so I will take a moment to introduce myself. My name is Darlene Rak. I started training and showing Rottweilers in the early 1980's. I have trained all over the country and up to the CDX level. Due to health issues of my dogs (not to mention taking care of my 5 children) I have not yet titled at that level, but I have put CDs on two different Rottweilers. I have also trained or shown in conformation, agility, tracking, and Schutzhund. I have also had Delta certified Rottweilers and am a certified CGC Evaluator. I joined DDTC in 1992 and became an instructor in 1993. I became DOT the first time in the late 1990's until we moved away in June of 2000. I have also held the positions of Board member and Registrar. One of our club's responsibilities is to provide quality dog obedience instruction to the general public. It helps pay the bills and we ultimately get many new members from people who just initially came to take one puppy or beginner's class. We need many people to instruct or assist to help our program remain the excellent one that it's always been.

To say that DJ was happy about it would be to minimize the excitement, thrill, and joy that exploded in the ring after her run; Cognac was her usual calm, poodley self. And Rich Strong probably hasn't been hugged that much before - at least not in the Utility ring. Congrats to DJ and Cognac. On to Open B and Utility B - UDX is in your future. Following DJ's success, Doug Scott and Gunner, Brittany, also qualified in Utility to earn their UD and take home a red ribbon for 2nd place. NEW USE POLICY FOR OPEN TRAINING RINGS ON OBEDIENCE TRAINING NIGHTS

We have a number of people training at the open/utility level and we are very proud of them! Unfortunately it is sometimes difficult for everyone to get in a ring when they need to. Your Training committee has instituted the following policy to allow everyone equal opportunity in any available rings, effective January 1, 2008. There will be a sign up sheet in each ring listing times in 15 minute slots from 6pm until 9:30 pm. You may sign up for one 15 minute slot in one ring on any given night. If after your 15 minute slot you would like to work your dog more you may then sign up again for another 15 minute time frame. Rings 1, 2, and 3 will be reserved for instructors at 6:30pm so that they may train their dogs and get ready for their classes. It is up to you to pay attention to your time and be out of the ring when your 15 minutes are up.
