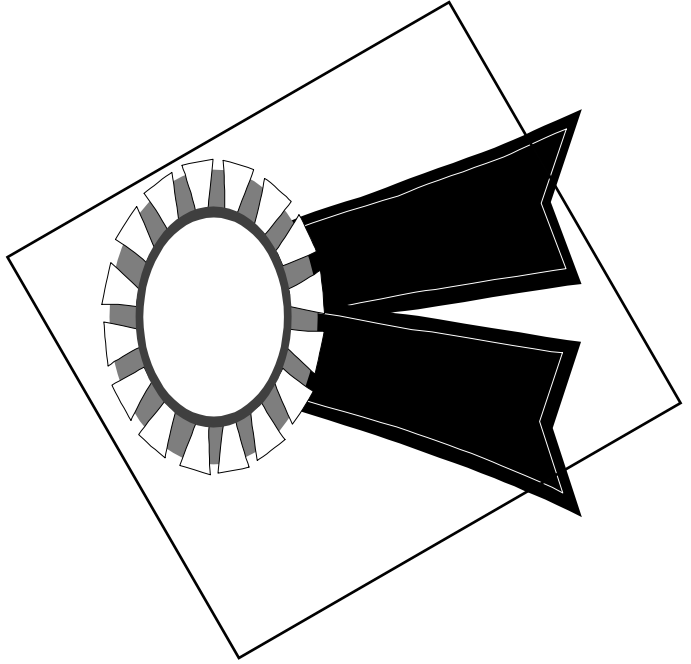


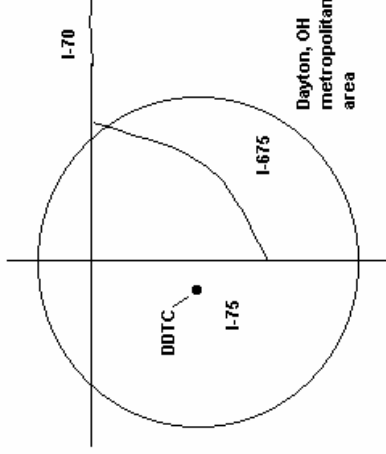
Trials and Community Events

As a member of the American Kennel Club, Dayton Dog Training Club follows AKC rules and regulations. For example, the club:

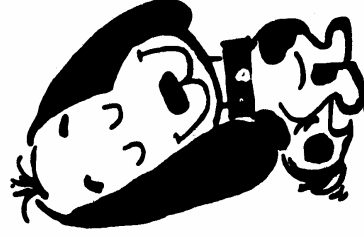
- ◆ Offers constructive and well planned basic obedience classes to the public.
