ACT1 is an entry level test that is open to all dogs that have
not earned a title in any AKC Agility class and that meet
the age and physical requirements for a regular AKC

Agility trial (Chapter 1, Section 3). Dogs must have two passing
ACT1 scores in order to earn the ACT1 title. Both passing scores
may be obtained under the same evaluator. To receive the title
certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must
be registered/listed with AKC.

ACT2 is the second level Agility Course Test that is open to all dogs
that have not earned a title in any AKC Agility class except as ACT1
title and that meet the age and physical requirements for a regular
AKC agility trial. Dogs must have two passing ACT2 scores in order
to earn the ACT2 title. To receive the title certificate and have the
title added to the dog's record, the dog must be registered with AKC.
The ACT2 title will supersede the ACT1 title on a dog's record.

For the ACT Program dogs may participate at any jump height determined by the owner. The following official AKC jump height table is for information only. There is no regular/preferred distinction at an ACT Event

Height Divisions

Owners are responsible for entering the proper height divisions.

Regular classes

8 Inches	For the regular class dogs 11 inches and under at the withers.
12 Inches	For the regular class dogs 14 inches and under at the withers.
16 Inches	For the regular class dogs 18 inches and under at the withers.
20 Inches	For the regular class dogs 22 inches and under at the withers.
24 Inches	For the regular class dogs over 22 inches at the withers.
24C Inches	Dogs may be entered at this height at their owner's discretion if their measurement is 22 inches and under at the withers

Preferred classes

4 Inches	For the preferred class dogs 11 inches and under at the withers.
8 Inches	For the preferred class dogs 14 inches and under at the withers.
12 Inches	For the preferred class dogs 18 inches and under at the withers.
16 Inches	For the preferred class dogs 22 inches and under at the withers.
20 Inches	For regular class dogs over 22 inches at the withers.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with The American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

EQUIPMENT AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on turf. Ring size will be 85x97'.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all rounds are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during the specified walk-through period held prior to the start of the round. There will be a practice jump to warm up dogs ahead of their run.

RIBBONS

Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:
Qualifying Score Dark Green ribbon

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS – REGISTRATION AND DAY OF EVENT

- All rights to TELEVISION, VIDEOTAPE, ADVERTISE, PHOTOGRAPH, PROMOTE or otherwise exploit these events are in the club, or in persons to whom assignments of such rights have been made in writing by the club. All persons and animals on the show grounds at any time while this event is in progress, do by attending this event or participating therein, grant to the club the right to photograph, televise, videotape, audiotape or otherwise use their likeness and voice in any manner without further release or consent. This event may be televised. **Video and photographs taken at this event may be used on Facebook page.**
 - **Telegraph, Telephone, Fax, Email and unsigned entries cannot be accepted.** Entries not on official AKC entry forms, downloaded and/or photocopies of entry forms without agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form are not acceptable.
 - Mail all entries with fees to the Trial Secretary. Entries received without fees will not be accepted. Confirmation via email will be made no later than 3 days before the trial. Should confirmation email not be received by the exhibitor within 3 days of the trial please contact the trial secretary.
 - Make all checks and money orders payable to DDTC, no credit or debit cards will be accepted for payment. Canadian exhibitors must make fees payable in U.S. funds. The trial Secretary assumes no responsibility for cash sent through the mail. An AKC recording fee of \$5.00 per entry will be required for each dog entered by any licensed or member club ACT Test. All recording and event service fees are paid to the AKC.
 - No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance—multiple entries made by one handler will be spaced day of the trial.
 - Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by veterinarian or judge or barred from competition by action of the event committee. If because of riots, wars, strikes, civil disturbances, national emergencies, health emergencies, and dictates of law enforcement or the owners(s) of the grounds and/or facilities or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the event, no refund of entry fee will be made. Extreme weather conditions, such as, but not limited to snow storms, hurricanes, lightning, extreme heat, heavy rains, or other circumstances including but not limited to the condition of the facilities or grounds and /or the ingress and egress from the grounds, must be considered to the health and safety of the dogs, exhibitors and spectators. The well-being of dogs, exhibitors and spectators is of paramount importance and in the event it is necessary to cancel or stop the event before completion, no refund of entry will be made.  - Postdated checks, returned checks do not constitute valid entry. If limits are met and your check is returned, the entry will be denied and that spot given to someone on the waitlist. If the trial is not full, the trial secretary will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check of \$20 and entry must then be made with money order only and paid prior to the closing date.
 - An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from refunds for processed duplicate entries discovered after the closing date. Every effort will be made to find and return duplicate entries before processing.
 - Errors on entry forms: Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, regardless of whomever may make such errors, and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the closing date.
 - Each Owner and handler listed on the entry form and/or individual responsible for the dog at a show is bound by the certification and agreement on the front and back of the entry form regardless of who may have completed and submitted the entry form.
 - Evaluator will not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners and handlers are responsible for the presence of their dogs when their classes are called to be judged. All dogs present must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when running
 - All dog feces must be picked up, failure to do so will result in a trial committee hearing and excusal from the show grounds without refund of entry fees.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations published for this event and any decision made in accord with them and further agree to be bound by this Agreement. I (we) agree that the club or ACT Evaluator, holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club or ACT Evaluator shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge or ACT Evaluator, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend, and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other persons. INSTRUCTIONS

Dogs may be entered in any jump height. There is no Regular or Preferred distinction at AKC's ACT events.

In order to acquire the ACT1 or ACT2 title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the American Kennel Club. AKC Canine Partners applications may be accepted at the event and submitted to AKC with the event results.

Dogs that are not AKC registered/listed SM may be registered at a later date and receive their ACT title at that time. Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine** Partners program should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the box AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
